The Courtenay Cadora Dressage Show is a sanctioned Bronze competition member of Equine Canada, 2685 Queensview Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2B 8K2 and is governed by the rules of EC.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPAL: Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. The EC is committed to upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value as a primary consideration in all activities, requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment; ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors, and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose; providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a manner of standard operating procedure; continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare, requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organizations' rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions, reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Rules

- 1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.
- 2. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing.
- 3. The horse's competition number must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
- 4. Riders and owners must be HCBC members. All riders and owners must have a bronze level sport license. A copy of HCBC and EC sport license must be submitted with entry
- 5. All riders regardless of age or level of competition must wear ASTM or BSI approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at the competition site.
- 6. Dress and tack must conform to EC rules. Please refer to EC Rule Book Section E Dressage.
- 7. All tests will be in 20x60 arena.

Entries

- 1. No horse may compete in more than four tests including freestyles.
- 2. Hors Concours entries will be accepted if time permits.
- 3. Riders may enter the same class more than once, but only the first score will count.
- 4. Each rider/horse combination must be entered on a separate entry form.
- 5. The competition reserves the right to refuse any entry.

Fees

- 1. Entry fees are \$30.00 per test for Walk/Trot and \$35.00 for Training to FEI and Freestyles.
- 2. Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees refunded. After the closing date class fee swill be refunded only with a Veterinarian's or Doctor's certificate. The administration fee will not be refunded.

Prizes

- 1. Rosettes to third and ribbons to sixth place in each class
- 2. Champion and Reserve Champion award (ribbon & prize) for each level- (highest combined score from two rides at same level. Must have a minimum of two competitors per level.
- 3. Overall high tests of show Junior and Senior rider ribbon & prize
- 4. Classes with only one entry will have ribbons awarded based on percentage

Stabling and Camping

- Stabling is available from 6:00 pm Saturday to 6:00 pm Sunday for \$25.00/stall clean stall deposit required (\$25.00 separate cheque)
- Overnight camping on grounds at \$15.00/night or \$20.00/night with electrical hook-up. Washrooms with showers will be open Saturday 6:00 pm until end of show
